

The Western Australia Disability Services Act requires all Local Governments to develop and implement a *Disability Access and Inclusion Plan* (DAIP) to ensure that people with disability have equal access to its information, facilities and services.

The City of Kalamunda is committed to facilitating the inclusion, participation and a sense of belonging of people with disability in our community through the improvement of access to its information, facilities and services. The City adopted its first Disability Service Plan (DSP) in 1996 to address access barriers within the community.

The City's Disability Access and Inclusion Plan is updated every five years. The plan is reviewed annually and an annual report is submitted to the Disability Services Commission.
