#### Background

At the Ordinary Council Meeting 23 June 2020, Council resolved to adopt 'Local Planning Policy 28 -Delivery of State and Local Strategies through the Preparation of Structure Plans' for the purpose of public advertising. The Policy will guide Council, the City of Kalamunda's officers and external stakeholders to identify the City's responsibilities for the preparation of structure plans in order to achieve the implementation of the State Government's North East Sub-Regional Framework (the Framework) and the City's Planning Strategies.

#### Promotional and Engagement Activities

Consultation progressed to iap2 spectrum level 'consult' to obtain public feedback on analysis,

alternatives and/or decisions. The feedback mechanisms used were a community survey (available both online and via hard copy), print advertisement in the local newspaper, publishing of the draft policy on the City's online engagement portal, promotion on the City's Facebook account and an enewsletter to the City's EngagementHQ subscribers.

#### Outcome

The project received a total of 21 survey responses with the key findings summarised in this report.

# **Survey Results**

Out of the 21 responses, 14 (66%) of respondents were female and seven (33%) of respondents were male. The age breakdown for respondents are: six (28%) aged between 36-45, eight (38%) aged between 46-55, three (14%) aged between 56-65, three (14%) aged between 66-75 and one (4%) aged 75.

The top two responses came from the suburbs of Maida Vale (10) and Wattle Grove (7).
