- April 2021 January 2022 (9 months)
- 329 surveys responses (60% from Gen Z)
- Social media campaign: 512 link clicks, 68,746 impressions
- Print media: flyers, survey and a newspaper ad
- Website, news and media releases

- 12 individual face-to-face engagement events that reached over 800 youth and community members.
- A commissioned flagship artwork by Leah Addison (local young artist)
