What We Do

Programs and Services

1. Moral Ethics & Wisdom Teachings

- ❖ Study of ancient cultures, and the teachings of ancient masters, saints and sages to promote moral values such as kindness, righteousness, respect, wisdom and trustworthiness, which are inherent in all humanity.
- ❖ To integrate ancient wisdom with contemporary living to bring about peace and harmony in the family, and in society.



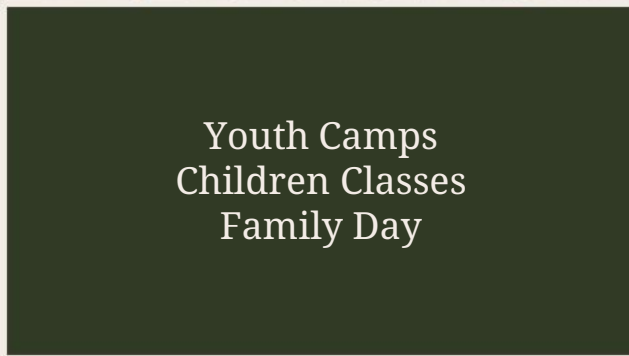
1. Moral Ethics & Wisdom Teachings

Activities include:

- ❖ In-person or online study classes (weekly)
- ❖ Workshops (fortnightly), including training of volunteer service personnel
- ❖ Seminars (monthly)
- ❖ Annual conference
- ❖ Youth camp (annually during school holidays)







2. Traditional Arts and Culture

To foster and preserve ancient and traditional cultures.

Activities include:

- ❖ Ancient cultural ceremonies to pay respect and gratitude to the land, the sovereign, parents and ancestors, ancient masters and teachers.
- ❖ Celebration of traditional and cultural festivals
- ❖ Courses on traditional arts, music and language
- ❖ Culture appreciation sessions or exhibitions





3. Charity and Disaster Relief

- ❖ To encourage the practice of selfless service and selfless love to realise that humanity is one family. All people are interconnected through shared humanity, regardless of their ethnicity, nationality, faith or socioeconomic background.
- ❖ Activities include:
 - To provide volunteer service for the operation of the Society and all its services and activities;
 - organise outreach programs such as food distribution or community assistance;
 - support other charities.



4. Holistic Health and Natural Medicine

- ❖ To promote a healthy vegetarian lifestyle that nurtures the body, mind, and spirit.
- ❖ Activities include:
 - Vegetarian Food Fairs (annually or biannually)
 - Vegetarian cooking class
 - Health workshops and demonstrations on natural medicine and therapies.
 - Collaborations with practitioners for holistic health events.





5. Sustainable Living & Self-Sufficiency

- ❖ Maintenance of community gardens, eco-friendly projects, or sustainable production workshops.
- ❖ Awareness programs on sustainability and environmental conservation.



Property Overview & Plans

- ❖ Current use: small gatherings, committee meetings.
- ❖ Hired venues are used for medium to large events.
- ❖ Indicative development plans include:
 - Various additions and alterations to existing buildings including auditorium, commercial kitchen, toilets, storerooms etc.
 - Car parking bays
 - Upgrades to building façade and external areas, and vehicle access driveways.
