2024 PLANTS FOR RESIDENTS PROGRAM

- Online plant reservations open 9am on Monday, 29th April 2024 via <u>Plants for Residents 2024 Tickets</u>, <u>Woodlupine Family & Community Centre, Forrestfield | TryBooking Australia</u>
- Households can select up to 15 native plants.
- There is a limit of five (5) plants per species, per order.
- One order per household only. First order received will be deemed the valid order.
- Residents can only order from ONE timeslot and attend this pick-up timeslot.
- As this is a very popular program, at any time, the plant allocation may be exhausted before the closing date of 5pm on Monday, 29th April 2024. It is recommended to register as soon as possible to avoid missing out.

 If your preferred plants are not in stock or become unavailable, you will be provided with the closest substitute.
- Our plants list has been updated slightly, due to the nature of plants some are growing slower than usual and aren't of size to go out to public. We will endeavour to provide the most up to date plants list in the lead up to the event, however final selection of plants may vary between now and pick-up.







Acorn Banksia (dwarf) / Manyret Banksia prionotes

Banksia prionotes is a non-lignotuberous shrub or tree. It produces orange and white flowers towards Autumn, or in the Noongar six-seasons calendar system, Bunuru. It is a food source for the endangered Black Cockatoo.

Albizia Paraserianthes Iophantha up to 10m high

Shrub or tree that can stretch to 10 metres high. It occurs in winter wet depressions near to creeks and swamps. Its leaves are bipinnate, while the yellow flowers in racemes are produced from winter to spring.

Bacon and Eggs Gastrolobium capitatum up to 1m high

Prostrate to low, bushy shrub up to 1m high. Red (orange) and yellow (brown) pea flowers, winter to spring. Bee attracting, shade tolerant and dieback resistant.

Black Coral Pea Kennedia nigricans up to 4m tall

A trailing or twining shrub or climber, growing up to 4m tall. Produces black and yellow flowers in Winter and Spring. Apace plant summary: https://www.apacewa.org.au/plant/kennedia-nigricans

Blueberry Lily/Mangard Dianella revoluta up to 0.5m high

Rhizomatous, strap leaved perennial herb to 0.5 metres high with a 1 metre high flowering panicle. Blue flowers followed by numerous berries turning from green to a deep purple. A shade tolerant bush tucker plant.

Buttercup Hibbertia subvaginata up to 1.2m high

A generally erect shrub, growing up to 1.2m tall. Like many other Hibbertia species of the region, it produces yellow flowers from winter to summer.

Bush Flame Pea Chorizema Varium up to 0.3m high

A spreading shrub, growing up to 0.3m tall. Blooms in Spring, with orange and pink pea flowers. Can be seen growing on coastal limestone hills and outcrops.

Calothamnus up to 0.4m - 1.5m high

Erect shrub to 0.4 to 1.5 metres high with distinctive long needle leaves. Grows in swamps and winter wet depressions. Dark red flowers winter to summer. Shade tolerant. Attracts birds and bees.

Candle Hakea up to 0.5 to 3m high

Lignotuberous shrub to 0.5 to 3 metres high. Intense flowering stems of cream flowers in summer. Rewild plant summary: https://rewildperth.com.au/resource/candle-hakea/





Candlestick Banksia / Biara

Banksia attenuata

0.4-10 m high

Lignotuberous tree-shrub, 0.4-10 m high. epicormic buds. Fl. yellow, Oct-Dec or Jan-Feb. Sand dunes, sandplains. Rewild plant summary: https://rewildperth.com.au/resource/candle-banksia/

Couch Honeypot

Banksia nivea

0.6 to 0.7m high

Low groundcovering shrub 0.3 to 0.7 metres high. Golden orange flowers winter to spring. APACE plant summary: https://www.apacewa.org.au/plant/banksia-nivea/

Common Brown Pea

Bossiaea eriocarpa

up to 0.6m high

Low shrub to 0.6 metres high with the leaves arranged in two opposite rows. Pea flowers brown - yellow July to October. Rewild plant summary: https://rewildperth.com.au/resource/common-brown-pea/

Devil's Pins / Puyenak

Hovea pungens

up to 1.8m high

An erect, pungent shrub, growing up to 1.8m tall. Produces purple flowers winter through spring. Rewild plant summary: https://rewildperth.com.au/resource/devils-pins/

Dune Moses / Panjang

Acacia lasiocarpa

up to 1m high

Dense, compact fast-growing shrub to 1m high; masses of yellow flowers June to November. Bird attracting. Apace plant summary: https://rewildperth.com.au/resource/dune-moses/

Firewood Banksia (dwarf) / Bulgalla

Banksia menziesii

up to 2m high

Tree or shrub to 2m high usually with a lignotuber. Red, yellow flowers during autumn and winter. Bird attracting (including Carnaby Cockatoos), butterfly attracting, dieback susceptible. Rewild plant summary: https://rewildperth.com.au/resource/firewood-banksia/

Forest Sheoak / Kondil

Allocasuarina fraseriana

5-15m high

Dioecious, erect tree, 5-15 m high, bark fibrous, reddish-brown. Fl. brown, May to Oct. Lateritic soils, white, grey or yellow sand. Jarrah forest, sand dunes.

Graceful Honeymyrtle

Melaleuca radula

0.3 to 2.4m high

Shrub 0.3 to 2.4m high. Associated with granite outcrops and water sources. Pinkish mauve flowers during winter and spring. A shade tolerant resprouter that attracts bees and birds.

Green Stinkwood

Jacksonia sternbergiana

up to 5m high

An erect shrub to 5m high with pendulous branches, yellow/orange pea flowers most of the year. Shade tolerant. Will resprout after fire. Attracts birds, bees and butterflies.

Grevillea

Grevillea crithmifolia

0.6 to 2m high by 3m wide

Spreading shrub 0.6 to 2 metres high by 3m wide. Occurs in white or yellow sand over limestone and dunes. White flowers from winter to spring. Bird, bee and butterfly attracting. Has some shade tolerance. It is dieback susceptible. Apace plant summary: https://www.apacewa.org.au/plant/grevillea-crithmifolia/





Grey Cottonheads

Conostylis candicans

up to 0.4m high

Rhizomatous perennial grass like herb to 0.4 metres high. Globular yellow flower heads August to September.

Shade tolerant, hardy strap leaved groundcover.

Grey Honeymyrtle

Melaleuca incana

up to 0.4m high

Melaleuca incana is an upright shrub growing up to 4 meters high. It is found in seasonally wet flats, swamps and depressions. Its creamy white to yellow flowers appear between May and November. A bird and bee attracting species.

Hairy Yellow Pea

Gompholobium tomentosum

0.3 to 1m high

Erect shrub to 0.3 to 1 metre high. Yellow pea flowers mainly in winter to spring. Bee attracting and shade tolerant. Rewild plant summary: https://rewildperth.com.au/resource/hairy-yellow-pea/

Harsh Hakea

Hakea Prostrata

0.3 - 3m high

Erect to spreading non lignotuberous shrub 0.3 to 3 metres high. White flowers winter to spring. A shade tolerant and bird and bee attracting plant.

Honey Bush

Hakea lissocarpha

0.4-1.5(-3)m high

Erect to sprawling, pungent, lignotuberous shrub, 0.4-1.5(-3) m high. Fl. white-cream/yellow/pink, May to Sep. White, grey or yellow sand, sandy loam, granitic soils, laterite.

Kangaroo Paw, Red & Green / Kurulbrang

Anigozanthos manglesii

0.5-3m high

Rhizomatous, perennial, herb, 0.5-3 m high. Nov to Dec or Jan. Grey or yellow sand, clay, gravel.

Drainage lines, fringing wetlands, roadside gutters.

Kangaroo Paw, Red & Green / Koroylbardany

Anigozanthos viridis

0.5 high

The green kangaroo paw is an herbaceous perennial to 0.5m high. The flowers are green and appear in late winter to spring. Commonly found in winter wet areas. A shade-tolerant bird attracting plant.

Marno

Daviesia divaricata

3m high

Erect shrub or small tree up to 3 m high. Yellow/orange/red/purple/brown pea flowers from June to November. Apace plant summary: https://www.apacewa.org.au/plant/daviesia-divaricata/

Marri

Corymbia calophylla

30-40m high

Tree to 30 to 40m high on the Darling Range and 10–20 high on the Swan Coastal Plain. Abundant cream flowers during summer ensure a food source for birds, bees and butterflies. Carnaby Cockatoo food plant. A principle source of honey. APACE plant summary: https://rewildperth.com.au/resource/marri/

Mouse Ears

Calothamnus rupestris

1 to 4m high

Erect or spreading shrub 1 to 4m high. Blood red flowers during winter to summer. Bird and bee attracting plant. Rewild plant summary: https://rewildperth.com.au/resource/mouse-ears/





Native Wisteria / Koorla

Hardenbergia comptoniana

Twining shrub or climber, with masses of Purple pea flowers in winter to spring. A shade tolerant, Bird, Bee and Butterfly attracting plant that will resprout after fire. Rewild plant summary: https://rewildperth.com.au/resource/native-wisteria/

One-sided Bottlebrush / Queitjat Calothamnus quadrifidus

1m to 2m high

Erect compact or spreading shrub to 1m to 2m high. Deep red flowers winter to summer. Attracts birds. Rewild plant summary: https://rewildperth.com.au/resource/one-sided-bottlebrush/

Pincushion Hakea / Kodjet

Hakea laurina

up to 6m high

A tree that grows up to 6m tall. It produces red and white pin cushion shaped flowers from April to August. Rewild plant summary: https://rewildperth.com.au/resource/pincushion-hakea/

Prickly Conostylis

Conostylis aculeata

up to 0.5m high

Rhizomatous perennial grass-like herb. Tufted relative of Kangaroo Paws. Grows up to 0.5m tall. Occurs in dry and wetland soils. Yellow globular flowers in spring. Shade tolerant.

Prickly Moses / Mindaleny

Acacia pulchella

up to 1.5m high

A shrub to 1.5 m tall, branching freely; branchlets spine tipped, slightly flexuose, pale green, glabrous or with sparse, to 3 mm long, erect hairs.

Purple Flag / Komma

Patersonia occidentalis

up to 1.5m high

Western Patersonia: Rhizomatous, tufted perennial, herb, to 1.5 m high. Fl. purple, Aug to Dec/Jan.

Pultenaea

Pultenaea reticulata

up to 2m high

An erect dense shrub reaching up to 2m in height. It occurs around winter wet depressions and produces eye-catching yellow/orange pea flowers in spring. It's a bee attracting plant that is also shade tolerant.

Sea-urchin Hakea

Hakea petiolaris

up to 9m high

Erect shrub or tree, to 9 m high. Fl. pink & cream, Mar to Jul. Loam, granite. Outcrops Rewild plant summary: https://rewildperth.com.au/resource/sea-urchin-hakea/

Silky-leaved Blood Flower / Kwowdjard

Calothamnus sanguineus

0.2-2m high

Erect to open spreading shrub, 0.2-2 m high. Fl. red, Mar to Nov. Sandy or lateritic soils.

Sandplains, limestone ridges, rocky outcrops

Snakebush

Hemiandra pungens

up to 1m high

Small shrub up to 1m tall. Has Mauve or white flowers through spring and summer.

Shade tolerant and may attract butterflies. It's dieback resistant and can resprout after fire.

Swamp Teatree

Pericalymma ellipticum

up to 3m high

A small, erect shrub up to 3m high. Produces white/pink wax flowers with a pink/red centre from spring to summer. Shade tolerant and typically grows on seasonally damp soils

Tar bush

Eremophila glabra

0.1-3m high

Shrub, 0.1-3 m high. Fl. green-yellow-orange-red-brown, Mar to Dec. Sand to clay soils, sometimes saline, stony loam, limestone. Winter-wet depressions, sandplains and dunes.

Two-leaf Hakea

Hakea trifurcata

1 to 3m high

Rounded or open bird and bee attracting shrub, 1 to 3 metres high. Two distinctly different leaf shapes.

Flowers white, winter and spring.

Wavy-leaved Hakea

Hakea undulata

1-2m high

Erect, often straggly, non-lignotuberous shrub, 1-2 m high. Fl. white, Jul to Oct. White or grey sand, clay, loam, gravel, laterite. Apace plant summary: https://apacewa.org.au/plant/hakea-undulata/

Western Bottlebrush / Birdak

Callistemon phoeniceus

up to 1.5 to 6m high

Tree or shrub to 1.5 to 6 metres high with an open habit. Red bottlebrush flowers in spring to summer.

Bird and bee attracting shade tolerant plant.

White Gum / Wandoo

Eucalyptus wandoo

3-25m high

Tree, 3-25 m high, bark smooth, powdery or non-powdery. Fl. white-cream, Dec or Jan to May.

Sandy loam, clay loam, gravel, laterite, granite. Stony rises, undulating terrain

York Road Poison

Gastrolobium calycinum

1 to 1.5m high

Erect medium shrub 1 to 1.5 metres high. Red and orange pea flowers in winter to spring.

Shade tolerant Bird and bee attracting wetland plant. Poisonous to stock.

York Gum

Eucalyptus loxophleba

5 to 15m high

Tree or mallee 5-15 metres high with a well-branched crown. Bark is rough and persistent, fibrous and flaky. Flowers are white in winter to summer. Bird and bee attracting. Resprouts after fire.
