

Burning Periods

^{**}Please do not burn wet or green garden refuse. If your fire has wet material or is otherwise poorly managed, it can lead to excessive levels of smoke and can result in a neighbourhood nuisance. If the level of smoke is deemed to be creating a nuisance the City may issue an infringement.


Be ready by November 1

- As a measure to assist in the control of bushfires and pursuant to Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, property owners and/or occupiers of land within the City of Kalamunda, are required before 1 November to comply with the conditions as specified in the annual Fire Hazard Reduction Notice. This can be found at www.kalamunda.wa.gov.au.
- The applicable works as outlined in the annual Fire Hazard Reduction Notice must be completed before 1 November annually and maintained up to and including 31 March the following year.

Low Threat Minimal Fuel Vegetation

Minimal fuel condition means there is insufficient fuel available to significantly increase the severity of the bushfire attack. Low-threat vegetation includes grassland managed in a minimal fuel condition, maintained lawns, golf courses, maintained public reserves and parklands, vineyards, orchards, cultivated gardens, commercial nurseries, nature strips, and windbreaks. Properties of this description will still be assessed under this Notice and can apply for a variation.

A strip of land free of all flammable and combustible material with the intention of preventing the outbreak of a bush fire and provides visible safe access on the property for emergency vehicles and other firefighting operations. It is acceptable to install a firebreak around naturally occurring obstacles.

There are many ways to achieve the requirements and property owners can consider seeking professional advice from a contractor and/or Community Bush Fire Preparedness Officer.

Variations:

If you consider it impractical to clear or construct firebreaks and/or carry out other fire prevention work in accordance with the City of Kalamunda Fire Hazard Reduction Notice, you must complete an application form and apply for a Variation.

Requests for Variations must be submitted before 1 October. An administration fee of \$150 applies to applications received after 1 October up until 31 March the following year.

A firebreak is:

- To a width of 3 metres wide.
- To a height clearance of 4 metres.
- Free of all flammable and combustible material.
- Must have a corner turning radius of up to 10 meters
- · Continuous (no dead ends) and trafficable
- Installed as close as possible inside the entire perimeter of the land


1 November / Firebreaks

Firebreaks must be installed and maintained from 1 November to 31 March

Urban Property Preparedness - Best Practice

An Asset Protection Zone (APZ) is an area extending 20 metres from the furthest point around an asset building where there is reduced flammable material. This means there is less material that can catch fire, improving the defendability of a property.

- Maintain a fuel reduced zone around all buildings or assets of value which extends 20 metres from the outermost point of the building or asset and maintained to no more than 2 tonne per hectare. Dead grass, dead shrubs and dead plants shall be slashed, mowed, or trimmed down to a height no greater than 50mm across the entire property. Ensure gutters, roofs and walls of buildings are free of flammable matter.
- Trees over 5 metres in height must be under pruned up to 2 metres off the ground.
- Trees or shrubs within 2 metres of the asset must be pruned so that they have an overall height of no greater than 2 metres.



Regional and Rural Property Preparedness - Best Practice

Fire-Breaks

Install or upgrade a 3-metre-wide by 4-metre-high clearance free of all flammable and combustible material, continuous (no dead ends) trafficable fire-break as close as possible inside the entire perimeter of the land. A reticulated and maintained green lawn may be accepted in lieu of a firebreak - must remain green throughout the fire season.

Dead Flammable Wood

Maintain all dead flammable material below 8 tonne per hectare.

Slashing

Dead grass, dead shrubs, and dead plants shall be slashed, mowed, or trimmed down to a height no greater than 50mm across the entire property.

Clean Gutter Debris

Ensure gutters, roofs and walls of buildings are free of flammable matter.

Asset Protection Zone (APZ)

Maintain a fuel reduced zone around all buildings or assets of value which extends 20 metres from the outermost point of the building or asset.



Ensure gutters, roofs and walls of buildings are free of flammable matter.

Fuel load within the 20 metres shall be reduced and maintained to no more than 2 tonne per hectare.

Trees over 5 metres in height must be under pruned up to 2 metres.

Trees or shrubs within 2 metres of the asset must be pruned so that they have an overall height of no greater than 2 metres.

Property Preparedness - Best Practice

Pre-Season Property Preparedness and Compliance

- City of Kalamunda Community Bushfire Preparedness Officers are available to attend to private properties prior to the bushfire season to give advice and guidance in preparing land and/or property for the requirements of the Fire Hazard Reduction Notice.

Pets and Livestock

- Do you have a plan for your pets and animals? If you have livestock on a property in a high-risk area, consider either moving them to a safer location during the fire season or leaving them in well-grazed paddocks with supplementary feed.

Water Supply and Pumps

• If you choose to stay and defend your home, you need to have an independent water supply and pumping capability ready as scheme water may not be available due to infrastructure damage, power cuts or firefighting activity.

Total Fire Ban

Total Fire Bans (TFBs) are declared by the Minister for Emergency Services on advice from DFES.
TFBs are made based on weather conditions and firefighting capability. It is declared by the Minister for Emergency Services on advice from DFES.

The ban includes all open fires for the purpose of cooking or camping. It also includes incinerators, welding, grinding, soldering or gas cutting.

An exemption may be granted if you can show you are taking proper steps to prevent any fire spreading, and can control and put out any fire that may start.

Exemptions can cover specific times and locations and can be changed or cancelled at any time.

Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans

A Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban is a ban that individual local governments are responsible for issuing under the *Bush Fires Regulations 1954 Section 38A, and/or Section 24C*.

Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans are issued by City of Kalamunda and are put in place when the Chief Bushfire Control Officer identifies the use of engines, vehicles, plant, or machinery as high bushfire risk activities. A Harvest and vehicle Movement Ban may be issued at any time of the day.

It is the responsibility as a property owner or resident to be aware of any bans in place before undertaking an agricultural activity including harvesting as you could be fined. But more seriously, you would be responsible for putting your property, family, and community in danger.

A Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban can be in place for any length of time. It is most likely to be imposed during the 'heat of the day'. The City can extend or cancel this at any time if weather conditions change.



Preparedness / Fire Bans

Alternate Options to Burning

Skip Bins

City of Kalamunda residents can select from either a general waste skip bin (blue) or green waste skip bin (green). Households are entitled to any combination of up to three skip bins per financial year (excludes commercial and industrial premises). Both the general and green waste skip bins are three (3) cubic metres.

Households that meet the following criteria can are entitled to an additional green waste bin(s) only to assist with bush fire management.

- One (1) additional green waste bin is available for properties between 2000m2 - 5000m2
- Two (2) additional green waste bins are available for properties over 5000m2

The green waste from the green skip bins is mulched and reused, reducing the amount.



Walliston Transfer station is closed when a Vehicle and Harvest Movement Ban has been issued.

City of Kalamunda residents and ratepayers do not pay fees for non-commercial use of the Walliston Transfer Station. To gain free access, you will need to bring your Entry Pass along with Photo Identification with residential address (i.e. Drivers Licence).

A Vehicle Permit Scheme applies to City of Kalamunda residents/ratepayers who use vans, trucks, branded or sign-written vehicles and/or trailers. Fees will apply for commercial use.
