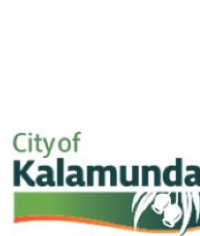

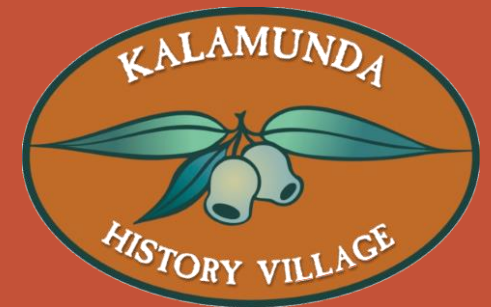

Education Program Tours:

GUIDED TOURS - have maximum capacity of 60 students.

Early Settlers - Pre-primary & Year 1.

Junior Pioneer Life - Years 2 & 3.

Pioneer Life - Years 4 - 6.

Cost: \$11.00 per student

Accompanying parent/adult cost \$4.00 each
Teachers and support staff - no charge.

SELF-GUIDED TOUR - maximum capacity of 90 students.

Pioneering Discovery - a tour with activities for any age and for any size group, small (min 10) or large. Equipment and tour notes are provided.

Guided Tours

Students move around the Village with a guide giving an insight into early hill's life; the services, school procedure, transportation, industries, migrants and how the settler's used their environment and their way of life from 1860's to 1920's. Comparison will be made from the early years to today's world and discussion is initiated about the social, cultural and technological changes from the past norms to present day society. In addition there are a range of hands-on activities that are to be chosen and facilitated by the visiting school's teaching staff.

Self-Guided Tour

This tour lets you move around the various sections of the museum with students at your own pace. The tour has many educational activities to do throughout the tour and a variety of old-fashioned toys and games to play with along the way. Guide notes are provided, and helpful instructions and flash cards are at each section to help explain facts and prompt discussion among the students.



History Village Shop

Our shop will be opened to students only upon teacher's request at the time of booking. Children can visit the old general store at the end of the tour to purchase vintage inspired goodies using cash money, coins or notes.

Tour Highlights

Students will sit at old fashioned timber desks in the original Kalamunda State School exploring olden day class activities, including the use of slate boards. The students will visit the old cottage to see how the settlers lived, and how life was before scheme water and electricity. The Blacksmith, Lightning fruit grader, Post Office and washing day are among the favorites.
