There is a lot to enjoy on this easy loop walk with frequent rest points around Lesmurdie Brook.

Bridges and seats, handcrafted by local craftsman Pieter Baarspul, are located along the Trail providing opportunities to watch the brook meander and cascade down towards the spectacular Lesmurdie Falls.

Friends of Upper Lesmurdie Falls is a volunteer group engaged in stream and flora rehabilitation, heritage preservation, and access improvement in Mundy Regional Park above Lesmurdie Falls.



The cultural trail was completed in 2022 with the help of Uncle Neville Collard who provided the knowledge for the signs. Each sign on the trail tells a story about Aboriginal life, culture, and use of plants in the thousands of years before European settlement.

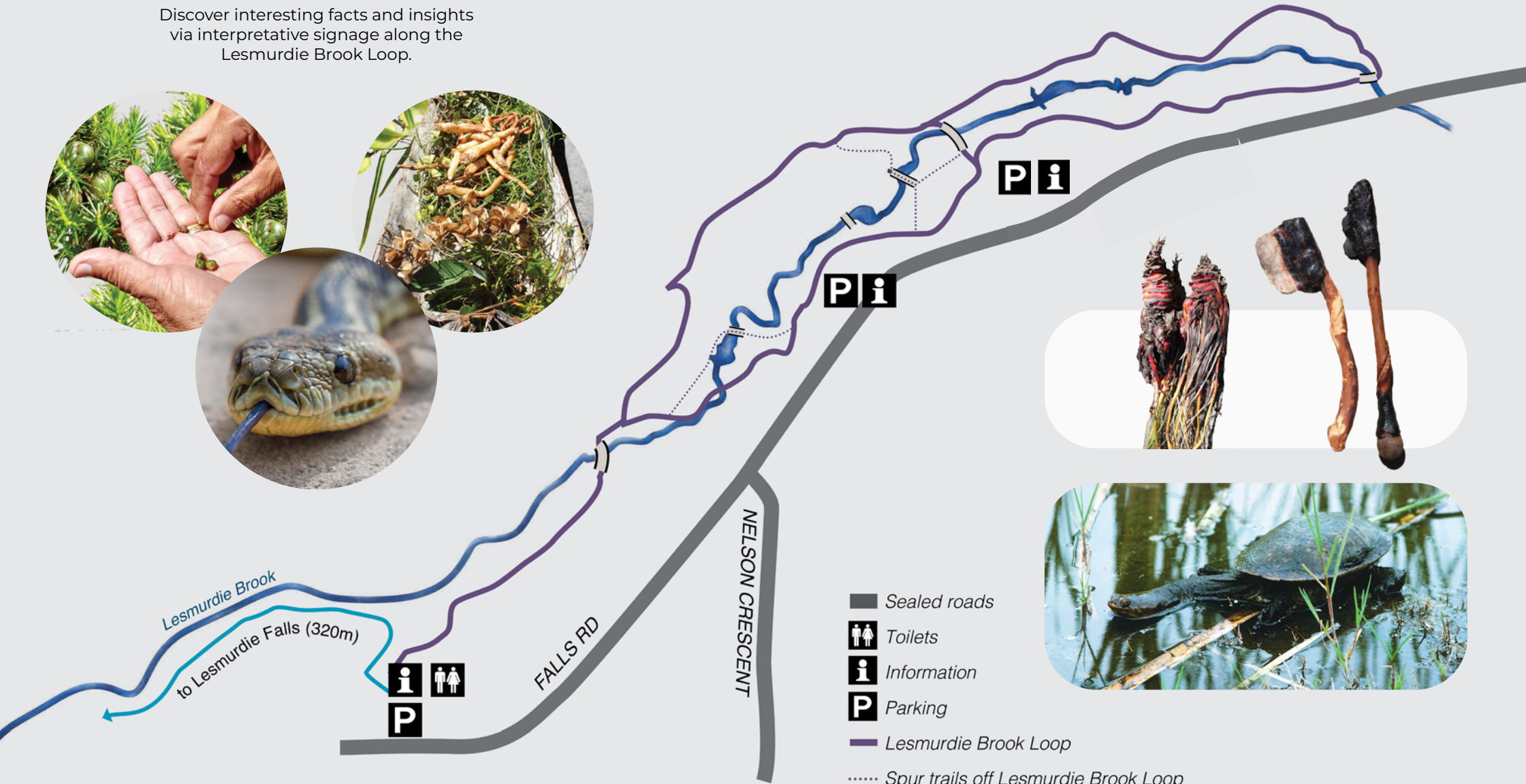
