YOUR FOGO WASTE HAS COME FULL CIRCLE: FROM YOUR BIN TO YOUR GARDEN FOGO

How to use your FOGO Compost:

Ensure you follow the health warnings printed on the bag - personal protective equipment (PPE) such as gloves and mask is recommended. Wash hands immediately after use.

Add to existing garden beds to add organic matter - ensure you follow the directions on the back of the bag. Take note of native plant instructions as they need a lower ratio of compost mixed in.

The FOGO Compost is certified to Australian Standard ASA454 and contains FOGO-derived-material collected from FOGO bins in the City of Kalamunda. The FOGO Compost is processed and packed in WA by Purearth.

How your FOGO Compost is processed:

- 1. The kitchen food scraps (from your caddy) and garden waste are placed into the lime-green lidded FOGO bin.
- 2. Once it's collected, it heads to the processing facility where it's shredded, screened and checked for anything that doesn't belong.
- 3. Next, it goes to our composting partners where it's mixed with other organic matter such as garden clippings and chicken manure.
- 4. Then, it's placed into long rows and aerated for several weeks while it naturally breaks down at around 60 degrees Celsius.
- 5. After that, the compost is screened, tested for quality and safety, and blended into different mixes suitable for gardens and landscaping.

6. The end result is clean, tested compost that's ready for local gardens - it's a great example of a circular system that starts right at home!
